Retired Army Col. Is Winner Silver Screen Legend XVII

Apple Valley, CA. The drum was packed with more than 17,000 ticket stubs representing tickets sold throughout 2014 to ticket buyers/donors in every state in the country plus Canada. The lucky winner is **Lt. Col. Jonathan Sylvie (U. S. Army, Ret.) of Austin, TX.** The winning ticket number was **12258**. Col. Sylvie has been a generous ticket buyer/donor to the foundation for several years and purchased \$500.00 worth of tickets this year. Col. Sylvie is the first Silver Screen Legend winner from the State of Texas. He is a graduate Engineer from the University of Texas and works for an architectural and engineering firm in Austin. As part of his military service, he spent a year in Iraq. Col. Sylvie, 44, and his wife, have purchased a Henry Mini Bolt Youth .22 single-shot rifle for their 10 year old son for Christmas. Col. Sylvie raises prize winning Texas Longhorns on his Copper Creek Ranch and is an NRA Member, gun collector and skeet shooter.

To date, the Silver Screen Legend project has raised almost \$2 million dollars for abused children. It is truly a unique case of guns doing good things for kids. The Happy Trails Children's Foundation is a charitable non-profit organization.
